

## Classroom Climate Framework




Figure 1. Interactive effect of student development and classroom climate on learning. Adapted from Ambrose et al. (2010, p. 157).




Figure 2. Extended framework of classroom climate.

## What I Learned in Class Today

#### Original 2007 Project

- Started by Indigenous students as a response to problematic experiences in the classroom
- Project Outcomes: 20 Minute Original Video, Inter-active Video Transcript Viewer and Archive, pedagogical tools for teaching and learning, institutional changes

#### Renewed 2018 Project

- Significant changes within institution, local and national initiatives
- Asking: What are the current experiences in classrooms when Indigenous topics are present
- Project Outcomes: Faculty and student perspectives videos, discussion articles, IVT, and facilitation Guide
